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

SUBJECT: PROPOSED SALES TAX 2007 EMPLOYMENT DATA AND 2008
POPULATION DATA

ISSUE

Several Board members and several representatives from Councils of Government asked that we update the 2004 population and employment data that we previously used to estimate subregional equity for the proposed one-half cent sales tax expenditures. Attachment A presents the updated Employment data. The Population data update was previously delivered on July 18, 2008. The Population data update (Attachment B) has been slightly modified to move La Canada from the Northern Corridor Cities to the San Gabriel Valley.

BACKGROUND OR DISCUSSION

Attachment A is a table showing 2007 employment as estimated by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG), along with percentages for each subregion of the total County employment. The City of Los Angeles employment has been removed from all of the other subregions and shown as total City employment. The northern corridor cities have been grouped together at the request of their Board representative.

Staff initially contacted the Employment Development Department (EDD) to obtain current employment estimates. EDD staff indicated that the data could be prepared (at the zip code level) for a fee, and delivered within one to two months. As an alternative, staff contacted SCAG, and acquired these estimates, which were available at the census tract level.

These data were developed by SCAG using EDD data, and Census Transportation Planning Package (CTPP) data as follows:

- 1) 2005 EDD data (Workers by Home location) were summarized,
- 2) Employment locations for workers were estimated based on CTPP Journey to Work data,
- 3) SCAG extrapolated the data, from 2005 to 2007.

NEXT STEPS

Staff will incorporate these updated data in our subregional project comparison charts.
