


MTA ART PROGRAM, LA.

The city that's the symbol of car culture is knitting its far-flung neighborhoods back into a single metropolis with a massive system of light rail, commuter



railroads and subways. Though the endless construction has not been pretty, stations will be—thanks to an extensive arts program. L.A.'s Metropolitan Transportation Authority now involves local artists early in the planning process, a policy that has resulted in artful, integrated design instead of applied decoration. The most effective works are often the most abstract, like the stained-glass panels on lollipop sticks by Jim Isermann (above) at Long Beach's Fifth Street station.
