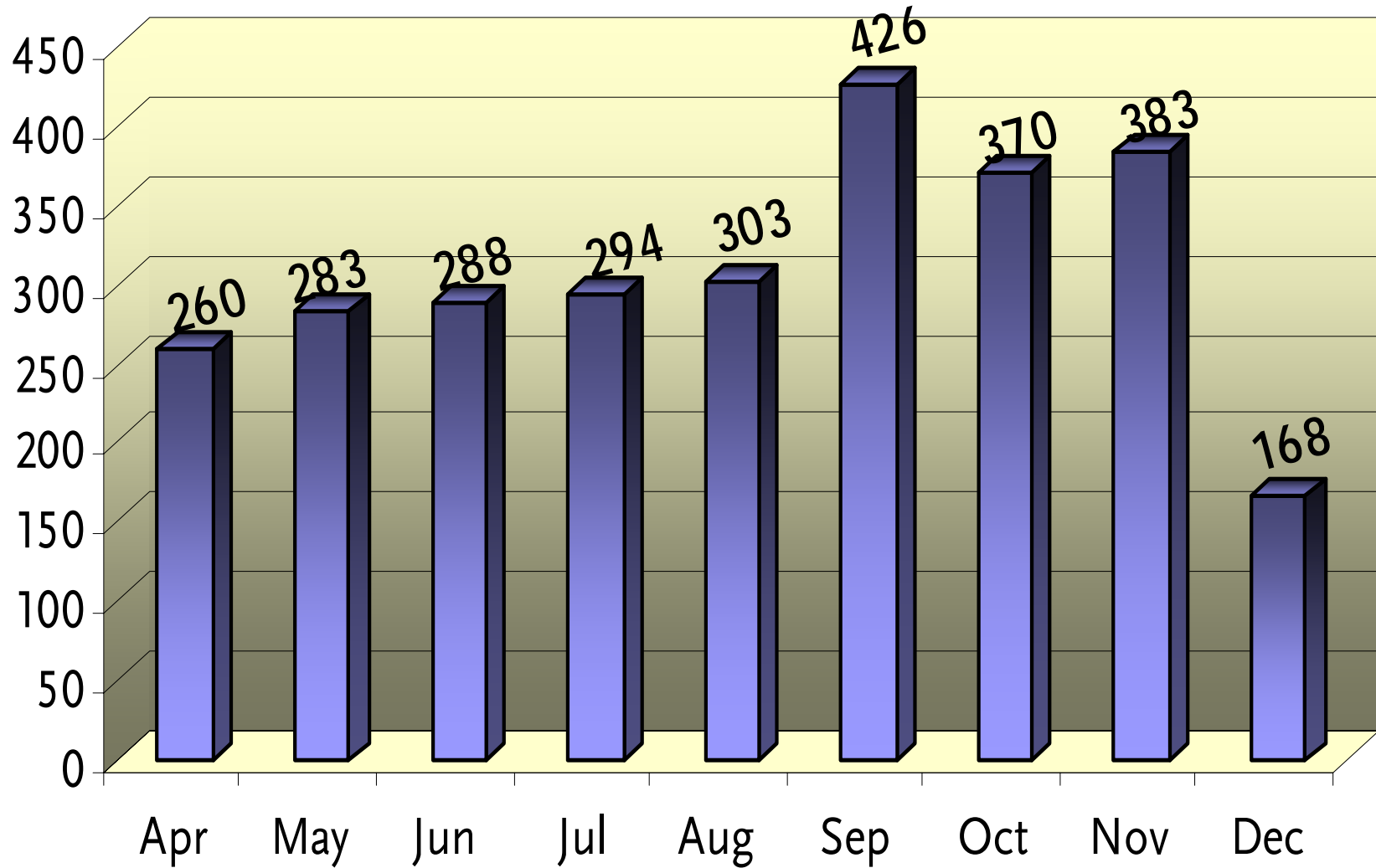

Bus Operator Training & Vacancies

Operator training completion rates for December were 53%; all classes are starting at or near capacity each week.

The average vacancies for January is 197, down from November's average of 279.

Vacancy number projected for next week is 177.
