CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 1:04 P.M.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the November 15, 1993 meeting were approved as submitted.

3. CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS

Mr. Kruse commented that the RCC Ordinance is meeting with satisfactory success and that he spoke at the Transportation hearing chaired by Senator Katz. Mr. Kruse also expressed gratitude that Mr. Edward McSpedon had been appointed to a permanent position as RCC President.

4. PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

Mr. Weldon reported the following:

- •The manner in which RCC reports to, and works with, Hill International has been cited again by the FTA at their Quarterly Meeting as an example of outstanding performance.
- •The incident that occurred over the weekend associated with the Metro Green Line project, adjacent to the Marine station, was at an intersection controlled by the Santa Fe Railroad, not by MTA. An investigation is underway by the Metro Green Line staff and consultants to determine if there are any lessons to be learned from this incident.
- •The Wilshire-Western pavement was restored over the weekend and was opened to vehicular traffic this morning.
- •Mr. DePalm and the Metro Red Line construction staff at Barnsdall Park have been involved in charitable projects with school children from the Los Feliz school. Mr. DePalm spoke, enumerating the various fund-raising events and charitable activities sponsored by the Metro Red Line construction workers. He also mentioned the many thank you letters he had received from the children and the school.
- •The first construction bids were received last week on the Pasadena project and a recommendation for award is anticipated in January for the L.A. River bridge.
- •An agenda item is being prepared for the Pasadena Construction Manager contract to go before the MTA Board at the December 15th meeting.
- •A Letter of Award for the Light Rail Vehicle is expected to be generated by Franklin White by mid-December. The Light Rail Vehicle team will then meet with Siemens and issue a Notice to Proceed on that order, on schedule, in January.

- •The APTA National Safety Conference is being held in Los Angeles next week and the MTA will host the event.
- ●The Metro Green Line art project entitled the "Walk of Unfame," which is located at the Lakewood Boulevard Station and serves the cities of Downey, Paramount and Bellflower, has been well received by the communities and generated a lot of media attention. Ms. Emsden gave a brief presentation which included a videotape of television news clips regarding the art project.

Mr. Camacho moved, Mr. Anderson seconded, that the MTA consider:

- ●The RCC Board's recommendation to deny the request for substitution of Digital Communications, an MBE Subcontractor/Supplier, by the prime contractor, Steiny and Company, on Contract No. HO889 based on insufficient evidence to permit substitution; and
- •Authorizing termination of Contract No. HO889 with Steiny and Company in 30 days unless a contract for the supply of equipment with Digital Communications is produced.

Motion was approved.

9. METRO RAIL PROJECTS - CONTRACT NO. TS002 CONSTRUCTION SECURITY PROGRAM (SYSTEMWIDE) AMENDMENT NO. 5

The RCC Board recommended that the MTA authorize the Chief Executive Officer to execute Amendment No. 5 in the amount of \$1,459,264, which increases the total contract value to \$2,130,098. This contract is currently in option year one which will expire in June 1994.

10. METRO RED LINE, SEGMENT 2 - CONTRACT NO. B221
WILSHIRE/NORMANDIE STATION & LINE
APPROVAL TO INCREASE AUTHORIZATION FOR EXPENDITURE (AFE)

The RCC Board recommended that the MTA authorize the Chief Executive Officer to approve an increase to Contract No. B221, AFE Contract Reserve Fund, in the amount of \$2,883,252.

 - Mr. Anderson questioned why it was necessary to retrofit Segment 1. Les Durrant outlined reasons for the changes on Segment 1, as follows:
 - The change in the central control location from the maintenance yard to the Central Control Facility.
 - •Certain technological changes, which were expected to allow the use of fibers for applications like closed circuit television, did not materialize.
 - Mr. Raggio moved, Mr. Anderson seconded, to approve this item. Motion was approved.
