Minutes of Regular Meeting of  
the Board of Directors of the District

February 17, 1965

Upon notice duly given, the Directors of the Southern California Rapid Transit District met at a regular meeting in the Board of Supervisors' Hearing Room, 500 West Temple Street, Los Angeles, California, at 9:30 a.m. on February 17, 1965, at which time President Harry A. Faull called the meeting to order.

Directors Howard P. Allen, Kermit M. Bill, Mark Boyar, Robert F. Brandon, Harry A. Faull, Gordon R. Hahn, Leonard Horwin, Don C. McMillan, Douglas A. Newcomb and Norman Topping were present. Director Martin Pollard was absent.

Also present were General Manager C. M. Gilliss; General Counsel Milton McKay; Manager of Operations Cone T. Bass; Treasurer and Auditor H. L. Black; Chief Engineer Ernest R. Gerlach; Director of Public Relations Jack R. Gilstrap; Administrative Analyst Richard L. Manning; Thomas J. Reilly of Musick, Peeler & Garrett; and the public.

The Minutes of the Regular Meeting held February 3, 1965 were approved.

Certificate of Merit

Director Hahn presented the District's Certificate of Merit to Willie J. Greene, Operator-of-the-Month for February, 1965, in recognition of the outstanding courtesy displayed by Mr. Greene toward his passengers and the public.

Approval of Lease Agreement - AFL-CIO Sub-Regional Office

After discussion, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, it was

RESOLVED, that the General Manager be and he hereby is authorized to execute on behalf of the District a lease agreement with AFL-CIO Sub-Regional Office, Region 22, Lessee, covering Rooms 707 to 710, inc. of Transit District Building located at 1060 South Broadway, Los Angeles, for a two-year term commencing April 1, 1965 at a monthly rental of \$288.00; form of lease agreement subject to approval of the General Counsel.

Approval of Lease Agreement - Provident Life & Accident Insurance Company

After discussion, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, it was

RESOLVED, that the General Manager be and he hereby is authorized to execute on behalf of the District a lease agreement with Provident Life and Accident Insurance Company, Lessee, covering Rooms 625 and 626 of Transit District Building located at 1060 South Broadway, Los Angeles, on a month-to-month basis commencing April 1, 1965 at a monthly rental of \$101.00, and providing for cancellation of existing month-to-month lease agreement covering Room 805 of Transit District Building; form of lease agreement subject to approval of the General Counsel.

### Temporary Route Diversions

After discussion, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, it was

RESOLVED, that the temporary route diversions affecting Lines 53, 58 and 60-G, as described in report dated February 9, 1965 filed with the Secretary, be and the same are hereby ratified and approved.

### Changes of Bus Stop Zones

After discussion, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, it was

RESOLVED, that the report dated February 9, 1965 relating to bus stop zone changes, filed with the Secretary, be and the same is hereby ratified and approved.

Additional Leisure World Service - Line Nos. 120 and 124

After discussion, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimately carried, the following resolutions were adopted:

WHEREAS, for several years the District has provided service by its Line No. 124 for the residents of Rossmoor Leisure World, Seal Beach, from the main entrance gate of the grounds on Los Alamitos Boulevard to the City of Long Beach and other cities easterly in Orange County; and

WHEREAS, recently representatives of Rossmoor Leisure World requested that the District provide a direct service from within the grounds of Leisure World to downtown Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, based on present volume of traffic originating at Leisure World on Line No. 124, the staff recommends that the District institute, on a 60-day trial basis, a direct service from within the Leisure World grounds to downtown Los Angeles, as more particularly described in report dated February 11, 1965 presented to this meeting and filed with the Secretary;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Manager of Operations be and he hereby is authorized to institute, on a 60-day trial basis, a

direct service, to be designated as Line No. 120, from within the Leisure World grounds to downtown Los Angeles, effective as of March 29, 1965; subject to the prior approval of the Consulting Engineer;

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Manager of Operations be and he hereby is authorized to make certain changes in route on Line No. 124 in order to operate certain trips within the grounds of Leisure World, as discussed at this meeting and as described in said report dated February 11, 1965, effective as of March 1, 1965; subject to the prior approval of the Consulting Engineer;

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Manager of Operations be and he hereby is authorized to make appropriate revisions in the Official Route Authorizations of the District as adopted November 5, 1964 to reflect the institution of Line No. 120 on a trial basis and the above described changes in route description on Line No. 124;

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Manager of Operations be and he hereby is authorized to make appropriate changes in the District's Interurban Passenger Tariff No. 9 to include the one-way fare of \$1.25 on Line No. 120, with the provision that the Senior Citizen reduced rate will not apply on such fare.

### Operating Report

Mr. Black presented the Operating Report for January, 1965, a copy of which is on file with the Secretary.
