it was pointed out that SB 873 and AB 2008 are held
in Committee. SB 84 (Foran) may be amended to

include transit buses.

Under the Labor Legislation Section of the report, staff reported that Senator Sieroty had indicated that he was aware that his bill could not pass the legislature with the binding arbitration clause; therefore this provision was dropped and language included as set forth under items 2, 3 and 4 on page 5 of the report.

The General Manager noted the need to have legislation which provides for compulsory arbitration or fact finding so that the public can be protected against strikes.

Director Holen stated that if the
District is going to have impact in this matter,
we must have allies, which means the City of
Los Angeles, County of Los Angeles, etc. Director
