- There were no speakers at the Public Hearing

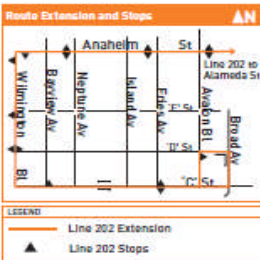
# EXISTING ROUTE LINE 202

ROUTE MAP (Not to Scale)

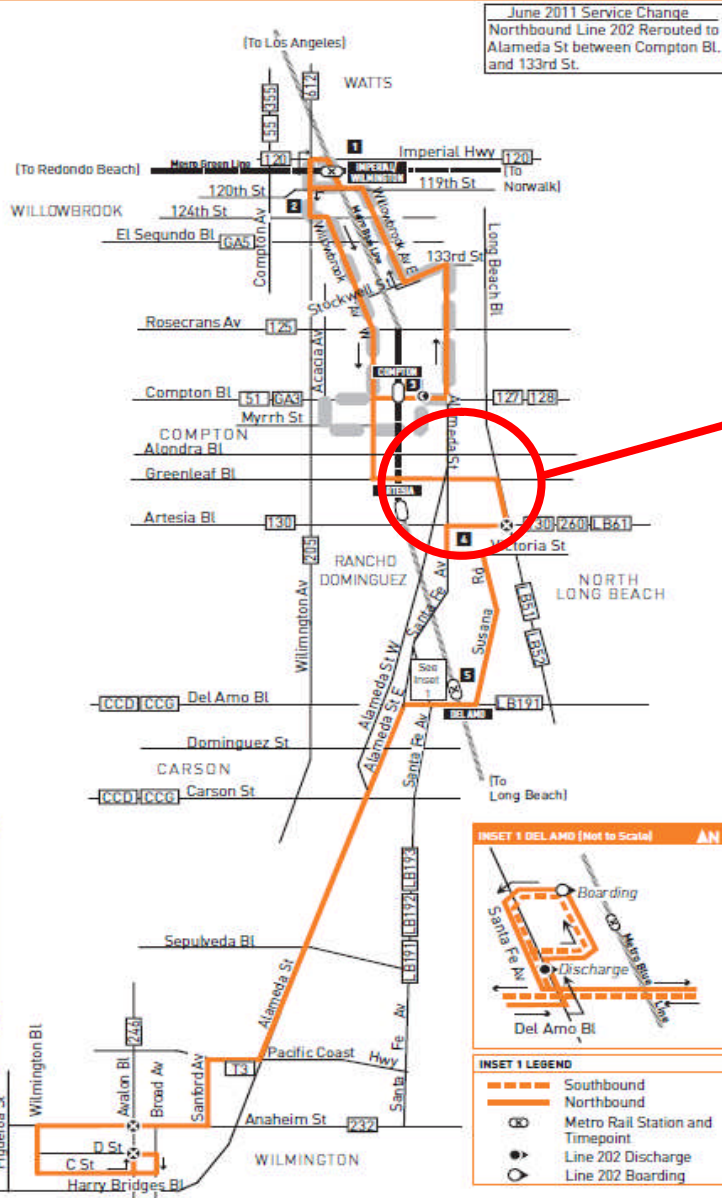

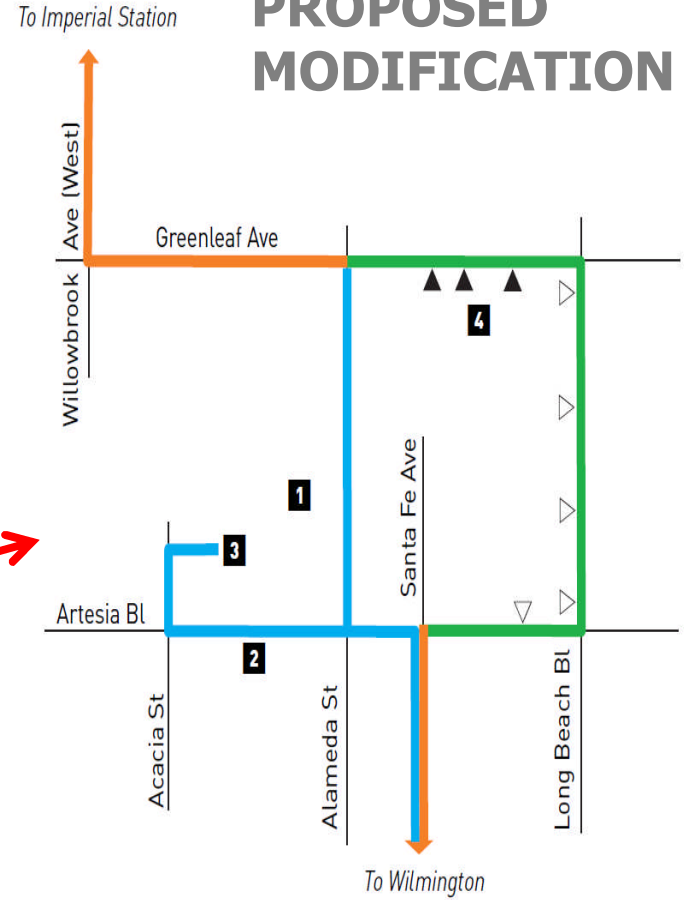

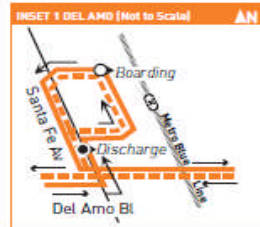


# PROPOSED MODIFICATION

## Responses to Questions/Comments from the Public Hearing

- **One suggestion to operate Line 202 with low floor buses.**

**Metro currently has a Request for Proposal to order up to 900 new low floor buses that will replace the high floor buses currently in use.**

- **One suggestion to serve the PCH Station on the Harbor Transitway.**

**Service to this station is provided by a transfer to Line 232.**

# **Staff Recommendation for June 2012 or later**

**Line 202 – Modify route as proposed to serve the new shopping center mall on Alameda St and the Artesia Blue Line Station.**
