# SAN GABRIEL VALLEY GOVERNANCE COUNCIL Monday February 8, 2010

SUBJECT: METRO SAN GABRIEL VALLEY SECTOR PUBLIC HEARING

ACTION: CONDUCT PUBLIC HEARING

#### **BACKGROUND**

During February 2010, Metro will conduct three public hearings to receive comment on proposals to implement major service changes in June 2010 or later. Federal guidelines and Metro policy require that a public hearing be held when major service changes are proposed. The system wide Notice of Public Hearing is shown in Attachment A.

The public hearing will comprise of two minor route changes. Each change will affect some passengers and the frequencies of service now provided. It is has been proposed that Local Metro Line 180-181 be modified in the Silver Lake area to serve Hyperion Blvd. Local Line 287 is proposed to be routed over 1st St. as a branch of the existing service, with both branches terminating at the Metro Gold Line Indiana Station.

Attachment A contains a copy of the public hearing notice. Attachment B contains copies of a PowerPoint presentation which includes maps and ridership along the affected route segment of each proposal. A detailed description of each change is described below.

Together, both of the proposed SGV service changes will be cost neutral.

# LINE 180-181 PASADENA/GLENDALE/HOLLYWOOD

A proposal was received from a Westside Governance Council member to create a new branch of Line 180/181 to serve the Silver Lake area along Glendale BI. and Hyperion Av. between San Fernando Rd. and Sunset Blvd.

- Every other trip would traverse the new branch every 30 minutes in the base period.
- Service along Los Feliz Bl. would decrease from a 15 minute to a 30 minute service in the base period;
- Boardings along the existing Los Feliz Bl. segment averages 340 eastbound and 450 westbound:

# LINE 287 EL MONTE/MONTEBELLO TOWNE CENTER/INDIANA GOLD LINE STATION

It is proposed that Line 287 provide service over a new branch along 1<sup>st</sup> St. from Atlantic BI. to the Metro Gold Line Indiana Station. This is due to the proposed cancellation of Line 31, which currently operates over the 1<sup>st</sup> St. route segment from Rowan Av. to Atlantic BI. The details are as follows:

- A Line 287 bus will leave every 30 minutes from El Monte Station, through Montebello Towne Center, to the Indiana Gold Line Station (as it does today);
- At Atlantic Bl., every other bus will turn either left or right; the Floral Dr. branch will turn right (as it does today), and the 1<sup>st</sup> St. branch will turn left and proceed to 1<sup>st</sup> St., then continue west on 1<sup>st</sup> St. to the Indiana Station;
- Service to and from the largest generators (El Monte, Montebello Towne Center, East Los Angeles College, and Indiana Station) will maintain the same level of service as provided today, which is every 30 minutes;
- Headways along Floral Dr. and 1<sup>st</sup>. St. will be every hour from Atlantic Bl. to Rowan Av.;
- Daily total boardings on Floral Dr. are approximately 120 in each direction; and
- Daily total boardings on 1<sup>st</sup> St. are approximately 240 in each direction.

#### **NEXT STEPS**

After the public hearing, staff will review all of the comments and report back to the Metro SGV Governance Council on March 8, 2010.

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority

The Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority will hold public hearings in February 2010 to receive community input on proposed modifications to Metro's bus services. Approved changes will become effective June 27, 2010 or later. Details of the public hearing dates, times and locations are listed in this notice.

The upcoming public hearings are being held in conformance with federal public hearing requirements outlined in Section 5307 (d) 1 of Title 49 U.S.C., and public hearing guidelines adopted by Metro's Board of Directors in 1993, as amended.

Listed below are the service proposals to be considered at the public hearings, and the service sectors that will be conducting them. In general, the proposed modifications will improve the efficiency of the public transportation system through a better use of limited resources. The public can attend any of these hearings and comment on proposals of interest to them.
